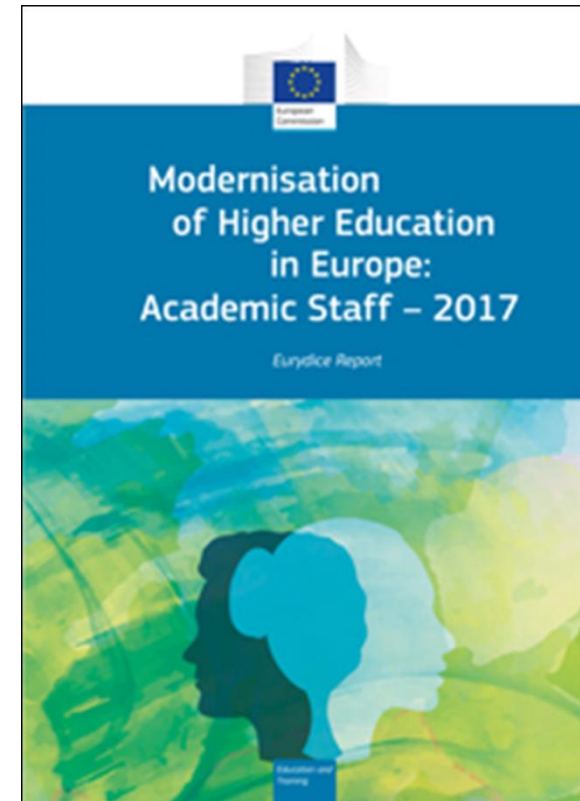

Eurydice report on Academic Staff

- *Continuing professional development:*
 - **Very few large-scale national initiatives**
 - **Left in the hands of HEIs**
- *Culture of under-valuing teaching*
 - **More teaching demanded from junior and middle rank staff, and less from senior staff**
- *Careers*
 - **Research output valued over teaching**
- *PhD candidates:*
 - **often receive no or little teacher training**
 - **rarely required to teach during PhD**
 - **either teach (too) many hours, or none**
 - **dissatisfied with teaching skills at the end**



Major challenges/opportunities facing teaching & learning

- *Technological innovation*
- *Diversity in terms of age and background*
- *Different learning styles as a result of the digital age (shorter attention span, motivational issues and lack of receptiveness to "sage on the stage" teaching)*
- *More demand for 21st century skills including ability to learn on top of sector-specific skills and knowledge*
- *More need for citizenship/civic education at tertiary level*

- *Ensuring flexibility in curricula to enable innovation*
- *Encourage open learning and innovation ecosystems to develop 21st century skills*
- *Building evidence about the characteristics of the student populations*
- *Offer incentives for institutions to enhance teaching and learning, as opposed to just research*
- *Develop dialogue and knowledge sharing*
- *Support pedagogical skills development*
- *Reward high-quality innovative teaching*
- *Align student trends with human resource management in HEIs*
