


## **South Africa – The Context to Doctoral Production**


- Current political economy of SA and human capital needs for development
- There are 26 universities in South Africa
- These are classified as traditional universities (11), comprehensive universities (9) and universities of technology (6), 1 million students in HE
- 2016 international enrolment: 22498 39.8% of SA doctoral students were International and 34.3% were from Africa (excl. SA)
- 2016 graduations: 2916 39.8% International and 37.2% from Africa, excl. SA
- South African universities produces about 2 400 doctoral candidates per year and the NDP target is 5 000 pa by 2030
- General concerns include:
  - Size of the pipeline
  - Average time of completion (around 4y compared to 2y min)
  - Average age just above 44
  - Full time vs part time
  - First generation drivers to the labour market
  - Constrained funding
  - Supervisory capacity




