First ASEM Rectors' Conference: Higher Education Leaders of Asia and Europe gather at Freie Universität Berlin to discuss Long-term Cooperation

Following the inaugural meeting of Asian and European ministers responsible for education, hosted by the German Federal Ministry of Education and Research in May 2008, the Asia-Europe Foundation (ASEF), the ASEAN University Network (AUN), the European University Association (EUA), and the German Rectors' Conference (HRK) are organising the First ASEM Rectors' Conference on the theme, "Between Tradition and Reform: Universities in Asia and Europe at the Crossroads", from 27 to 29 October 2008. The event will be hosted by the Freie Universität Berlin, and is supported by the German Federal Ministry for Education and Research.

The conference is an important step towards establishing a sustainable dialogue platform between Asia and Europe on higher education issues, in view of enhancing education cooperation and exchange among ASEM (Asia-Europe Meeting) countries. The high-level meeting will bring together around one hundred university leaders and education experts from ASEM countries to discuss higher education policy issues, such as governance and management of universities, quality assurance in higher education and trends in education and research cooperation between the two regions. University rectors and presidents will adopt recommendations on higher education issues and concerns to be forwarded to the 2nd ASEM Education Ministers' Meeting in Hanoi in May 2009.

Dr Soeung Rathchavy, Deputy Secretary-General of ASEAN, Ambassador Nguyen Quoc Khanh, Deputy Executive Director of ASEF, Mr Christoph Ehrenberg, Head of Division of the German Federal Ministry of Education and Research and Professor Dr Dieter Lenzen, President of Freie Universität Berlin, have opened the conference this morning. Keynote presentations will be delivered by Professor Dr Gu Binglin, President of Tsinghua University, China and Professor Dr Pierre de Maret, Board Member of the European University Association. The President of the German Rectors' Conference, Professor Dr Margret Wintermantel, will address conference participants tonight on the topic of the development of universities and their role in society.
